

Your trip to South Korea is just around the corner.

Along with a healthy dose of excitement, here's what you'll need to bring.



Clothing and accessories

- Omfortable walking shoes
- O Long and short-sleeved shirts
- Shorts
- O Pants/ieans
- Socks and underwear
- Sweatshirt
- Pajamas
- Hat (for sun protection)
- O Raincoat/poncho or umbrella
- Sunglasses
- Watch
- Small daypack
- Travel pillow
- Sleeping mask
- Earplugs
- Reusable water bottle
- Electronic chargers for your personal devices
- Power adapter (the standard voltage in South Korea is 220 volts at 60 Hertz and the outlet has two round holes)

Money

- U.S. dollars or Won in cash (money exchange is necessary. USD is only accepted for tipping. ATMs are available in the airport for withdrawal, or there are main bank stores for money exchange. Bring what you think you'll need.)
- ATM/debit card as back up (notify your bank prior to departure)
- Personal credit card (notify your bank prior to departure)
- Secure pouch for storing money and passport

Documents

- Passport and copy of passport
- Visas (if applicable for non-U.S. citizens)
- Oppy of itinerary (including hotels, flights, and EF emergency number)
- Oppy of any necessary prescriptions
- List of contacts and addresses (to send postcards home!)

Toiletries

- O Toothbrush and toothpaste
- O Dental floss
- Shampoo and conditioner
- O Soap
- Deodorant
- O Hairbrush/comb
- Nailcare
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray and mosquito bite ointment
- Extra contact lenses/glasses
- Medications (Be sure to carry them with you on the plane and keep them in their original containers. A customs official may want to check that each container's contents match its label. Be aware that some medications that are common in the U.S. are illegal in South Korea, including Adderall and some inhalers and allergy/sinus medications.)
- Wet wipes or antibacterial hand sanitizer

Travel tips:

- ✓ Pack light—you'll be responsible for loading your own luggage on and off buses (one small carry-on and your EF backpack should be enough)
- Pack valuables, medications, and an extra change of clothes in your EF backpack as a carry-on
- ✓ Keep in mind, many airlines now charge for additional luggage
